Winter is in full swing now and we are facing 0° C weather. I'm sure this is a refreshing thought for those experiencing a heat wave right now. Winter for us means cold, humidity, lots of layers of clothing and very low gas pressure. It is so low we have a hard time keeping our water heater lit and or enough to cook with. Lately we have to resort to cooking on a camp stove to get dinner on the table. But this is just part of our daily life and things you get used to. Like dealing with red tape and the bureaucratic process for everything. Latest on our list has been trying to figure out what to do about a car with duplicate tags the same as ours. This has become a common thing here lately to avoid taxes and tickets. That is how I discovered we had a twin car - I got a ticket in the mail from a place that I hadn't been. Trying to prove that it wasn't me has been an interesting task, which I failed and had to pay the ticket anyway. So far it involved two trips to the police station, two trips to the motor vehicle office to verify that I actually had the legitimate car (the first time included an hour and a half wait, the second, a two and a half hour wait), One visit to my legal advisors office, two trips to Buenos Aires (300 miles per trip), plus the expenses. I had to pay the ticket anyway and the problem of the twin car is not any closer to being solved. It is amazing how much time it takes to deal with this kind of thing. It keeps life interesting, I guess!
