It started raining and wouldn't stop. Our camp flooded twice in one week. Before we could clean up from the first one it flooded again. Yesterday I stood in our tabernacle in 36 inches of water. That is what 46 hours of nonstop rain will do. I'm glad our caretakers name is Moses and not Noah! It has been a long time since we

have had this much water. It seems to flood more often these days but never this bad. We are only two months from camp time, and this is a big setback. Time wise, all our projects have to be put on hold till the water goes down and we can get it cleaned up again. Financially there is just no way to know just yet how much damage was done and what we will be able to salvage. We have already lost some motors and wood furniture as well as my chainsaw, our old riding mower, a welder, and edge trimmer. This is just what we know off hand. Once

the water goes down and we get the electricity back we can test the refrigerators and freezer. These things were all stored up off the ground, just not 36 inches off the ground! This is a huge test of our faith as we have no funds or insurance for this kind of thing. But we do trust a great God who can do all things as he has done so many times before.
